During the late 1800s, at the height of the Industrial Revolution in the United States, the average American worked at least 60 hours a week to survive. And despite restrictions in some states, children as young as five years old worked in factories and mills doing the same jobs as



adults but earning only a fraction of adult wages. Unsafe working conditions were the order of the day. Labor unions, although still in their infancy, were becoming stronger, more vocal, and more violent. Unions were organizing strikes and rallies to protest long hours and poor working conditions in an effort to compel employers to negotiate.

One of these rallies was destined to become the first Labor Day parade in the United States. On September 5, 1882, the Central Labor Union in New York City, a large organization made up of members from many local unions, held a "workingmen's holiday." It began with a parade that included 10,000 people—all taking the day off without pay—and ended with a huge picnic in Wendel's Elm Park, the largest park in New York City at that time. The afternoon included speeches from union leadership and live music provided by the Jewelers' Union. Newspapers called it "a day of the people." Labor Day became a national holiday when Congress passed and President Grover Cleveland signed legislation on June 28, 1894, declaring the holiday to be celebrated on the first Monday in September.

Welcome Fall and everything that comes with it, unfortunately including influenza. Influenza (flu) can be a serious illness, especially for older adults. People 65 years and older are at higher risk of developing serious complications from flu, compared with young, healthy adults. This risk is due in part to changes in immune defenses with increasing age. While flu seasons vary in severity, during most seasons people 65 years and older bear the greatest burden of severe flu disease. In recent years, it's estimated that between 70 percent and 85 percent of seasonal flu-related deaths in the United States occur among people 65 years and older, and between about 50 percent and 70 percent of seasonal flu-related hospitalizations have occurred among people in this age group.

An annual flu vaccine is the best way to reduce your risk of flu and its potentially serious consequences. While flu vaccine can vary in how well it works, vaccination is the best way to prevent flu and its potentially serious complications. Flu vaccination has been shown to reduce the risk of flu illness and more serious flu outcomes that can result in hospitalization or even death in older people. While some people who get vaccinated may still get sick, flu vaccination has been shown in several studies to reduce severity of illness in those people.

Flu vaccines will be available to all residents and staff in late September/early October. We strongly encourage all residents and staff to receive one. We will also be offering a Covid booster vaccine to all residents and staff wishing to receive one as soon as they are available.
